### Pupil Premium Policy

#### **OVERVIEW**

Pupil Premium funding was introduced in April 2011, and paid by means of a specific grant based on 1 school census figures for pupils registered as eligible for FSM in reception to Year 11. For looked after children, the amount of Pupil Premium funding was calculated using the Children Looked After data returns (SSDA903). A premium has also been introduced for children whose parents are currently serving in the armed forces. This service premium is designed to address the emotional and social well-being of these pupils. Pupil Premium funding is additional to main school funding and it will be used by this school to address any underlying inequalities between children eligible by ensuring that funding reaches the pupils who need it most.

#### **INTENT**

1. Pupil Premium funding will be used to provide additional educational support to improve the progress and to raise the standard of achievement for these pupils.
2. The funding will be used to narrow and close the gap between the achievement of these pupils and their peers.
3. As far as its powers allow, the school will use the additional funding to address any underlying inequalities between children eligible for Pupils Premium and others.
4. We will ensure that the additional funding reaches the pupils who need it most and that it makes a significant impact on their education and lives.
5. The gap between disadvantaged pupils and others will be closed.

#### **IMPLEMENTATION**

1. Pupil Premium will be clearly identifiable within the budget.
2. The head teacher, in consultation with the governors and staff, will decide how the Pupil Premium is spent for the benefit of entitled pupils.
3. The school will assess what additional provision should be made for the individual pupils.
4. The school will be accountable for how it has used the additional funding to support the achievement of those pupils covered by the Pupil Premium funding and the head teacher will report to the governing body and parents on how effective the intervention has been in achieving its aims.
5. The governing body will hold the school to account for the effective use of the funding and for its impact on pupils progress and standards
6. The governing body will appoint a governor as the pupil premium 'champion' to regularly liaise with the head teacher about the use and impact of the pupil premium funding.
7. We will monitor the attendance of pupil premium children to ensure that they benefit from continuous learning and good attendance.
8. We will publish online information about how we have used the Premium and what its impact has been.
9. We will ensure that parents, governors and others are made fully aware of the attainment of pupils covered by the Premium.
10. We will seek to further develop strategies and interventions which can improve the progress and attainment of these pupils.
11. We will track the impact of the strategies put into place through the funding to ensure that we can show the value that has been added to the education of the entitled children.
12. We will monitor evaluate and review the success of the impact of the pupil premium funding to see that it is narrowing the gap.

#### **IMPACT**

This policy has played an important part in the educational development of the individual pupils who are entitled to the Pupil Premium funding. These pupils have been treated equally and as favourably as others and that the additional funding has been used well to address the challenges they face. The school has used the additional funding to promote the achievement and progress of all entitled pupils. The individual needs of each entitled child have been met. As a result of the additional funding, these children have made better progress and achieved higher standards than would have been likely without it.
