Dear Parents/ Carers,

We hope you have all had a lovely Easter and are ready for the Summer term. This term will be a busy and exciting term and our learning will be centred around the topics 'How will your garden grow?' and 'Where shall we go on holiday?'

Phonics

In phonics, we will be introducing level 4 as well as recapping and revisiting sounds and tricky words we have previously learnt. This will allow the children to consolidate their phonological knowledge and enable them to become more confident when segmenting and blending words to read and write.

Literacy

During literacy, we will be developing the children's independence when writing. There will be a heavy focus on writing phrases and sentences through varied and enjoyable writing opportunities.

Maths

In maths, the children will be continuing to develop their knowledge and understanding of number through subitising and exploring composition of numbers to 10. We will also be focusing on ordering numbers, comparing quantities and counting beyond 20.

Reading books

Please remember reading books need to be returned to school each day inside their yellow reading record. It is important that these books are read at home as often as possible to aid children's progress. We will change your child's reading book once they have become confident reading them. Please also continue to practise the phonics sounds using the sound mats previously sent home as this will help children become more confident with their reading.

PE

PE will continue to be every **Friday** so children will need to come to school wearing their PE kits.

General Information

Children will need shoes with velcro or buckle fastenings so that they can put their shoes on independently and limit the risk of tripping over untied laces. Please ensure your child comes to school with a coat and a water bottle every day and that all belongings/ items of clothing are labelled with their name. Please also make sure items from home (such as toys) are not brought into school. This is to avoid distraction and disruption during learning time.
