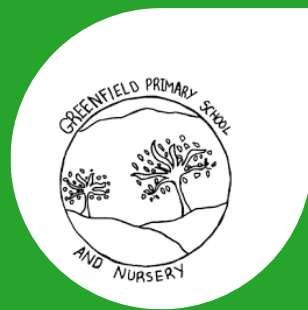

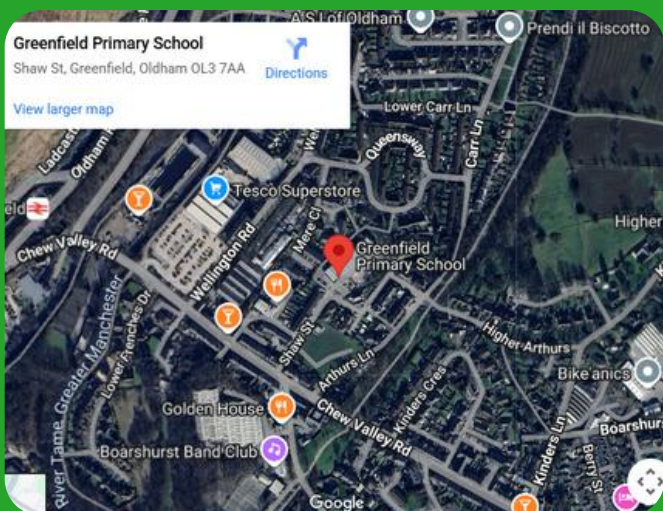

Our brand-new building, which opened on 1st September 2019, offers a modern learning environment as a two-form entry primary school. The original school, established in 1912, has given way to exceptional new facilities including a spacious sports field with football and rounders pitches, a running track, and fully equipped changing and toilet facilities for pupils and staff.

Inside, our larger classrooms, multi-purpose hall, dance studio, practical room, and exciting trim trail in the playground provide inspiring spaces for learning, creativity, and physical development.

Self-Esteem – We believe in ourselves and value who we are.

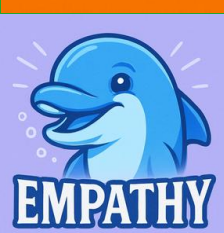
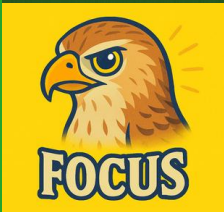
Focus – We give our best attention and effort to everything we do.

Admissions



It is helpful to school if parents register an interest at the school office. Parents apply online to the Local Authority Admissions Team for a school place. It is important if you want your child to come to Greenfield Primary School that you ensure we are your first choice on the electronic Common Application Form.

The admission number for Reception children each September is set at 60. There will potentially be two Reception classes of thirty children starting each September. Parents will be notified of an offer of a place in April before commencement in September.

Parents and children will be invited to visit school in the Summer Term before starting in September.

The admission process is managed by the Oldham Local Education .
