The children wore some fantastic costumes, worked so hard to learn their lines, created their own props and really did themselves proud with the effort they put into the singing, dancing and acting.

Last week, the Year 6s visited **Hollywood Bowl** to reward them for their effort and hard work throughout the year, where they enjoyed a game of bowling, dinner and time in the arcades!



To end their time with us, the Year 6s delivered a **Leavers' Assembly** to their parents this morning. The children shared memories of their time at our school, sang songs that are special to them and made sure there wasn't a dry eye in the room! Some certificates were also given out—a special well done to Joseph, who won this year's Trevor Rhodes' award for being a lovely member of our school community, a kind friend and working so hard throughout his time at primary school.

Our Year 6 children also received their **SATs results** this week. 89.5% of our children achieved the expected standard in both Reading and Maths, 78.9% achieved the expected standard in SPaG and 73.7% achieved the expected standard in Writing. Our school also achieved a huge 47.4% of children reaching greater depth in their Reading, 44.7% in SPaG, 31.6% in Maths and 13.2% in Writing. These results really are a testament to the determination, resilience and effort we have seen throughout the year from our Year 6 cohort. Well done to everyone!

After more than 20 years of dedicated service at our school, **Mrs Colley** is beginning her well-earned retirement this summer.
